## 2017 ANNUAL REPORT Albany County Business Development Corporation

Albany County Business Development Corp presented and approved 9 Al Tech Loan Fund applications in 2017 for a total of \$2,831,800.

The 2017 approved projects included funding for:

- A specialty furniture manufacturing company expanding their production capacity to satisfy orders from large multinational customers
- · A commercial welding contractor purchasing real estate for business expansion
- · A minority-owned bar and restaurant undertaking significant expansion of dining space
- A family-owned autobody and service business building a new facility to accommodate quicker customer turnaround
- A local café and bakery renovating their existing space to enhance customer experience and consolidate kitchen production areas
- The construction of a new machine shop for a specialized parts manufacturer
- Acquisition of real estate related to the change in ownership of a long-standing community bakery
- A sheet metal fabricator and contractor moving to owner-occupied real estate for future business growth
- A commercial cleaning company moving to owner-occupied real estate as part of business expansion

In 2017, the Corporation also reviewed and approved 1 Microenterprise Grant totaling \$23,000. This grant was made available through New York State's Community Development Block Grant program.

Additionally, the Albany County Business Development Corporation closed and disbursed \$2,261,800 in new loans from the Al Tech Loan Fund. As a result of these loans, a total of 91 new jobs are projected to be created and 189 jobs will be retained in Albany County.

The loans receivable balance in the Al Tech Loan Fund at the end of 2017 was \$12,498,971.
